Humanitarian Grants Programs

–Disaster Recovery

- The Foundation currently administers four disaster recovery accounts: Hurricanes Stan and Wilma (Guatemala and Mexico), Hurricane Wilma (United States), the Earthquake in India and Pakistan, and Solidarity in South Asia.

–District Simplified Grants

- Support the service activities of districts locally and abroad.

–Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grants

- Fund large-scale, two- to four-year projects that improve health, alleviate hunger, or promote human development.

–Matching Grants

- **Provide matching funds for the international service projects of Rotary clubs and districts in two or more countries: Small Scale; Large Scale; Competitive; Grant awards range from 5K to 200K USD**

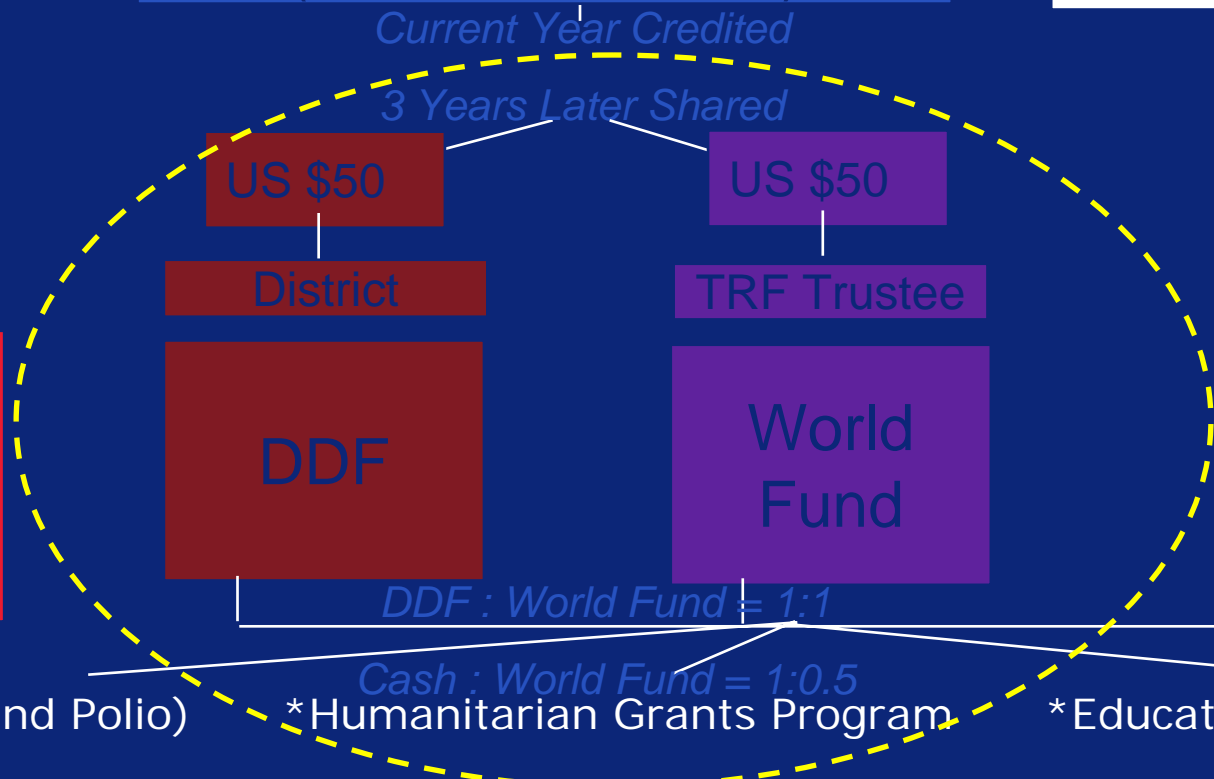

MG Application & Reporting

- Applications are accepted from 1 July to 31 March and approved from 1 August to 15 May. Requests over \$25,000 will be considered by the Trustees at their October meeting; completed applications must be received by 1 August.
- Grant sponsors may substitute the amount requested from the World Fund with DDF, if they wish to do so. Sponsors also have the option of requesting no award from the World Fund if the cash and DDF contributions pledged in the application exceed US\$10,000.
- All Rotary Foundation grants require the highest attention to stewardship. Progress reports must be submitted at least every 12 months for the life of the project. A final report is due within two months of the full expenditure of funds.
